Development

The main disarmament steps are: arms-liable nuclear weapons; other weapons of mass destruction; including chemical weapons; conventional weapons including any which may be deemed to be excessively inhumane or to have indiscriminate effects on civilians and non-combatants.

"Together with negotiations on nuclear disarmament processes, negotiations should be carried out on the bilateral reduction of armed forces and also multilateral agreements based on the principle of unbalanced reduction of the parties who are to give up or enhance control of a war military level taking into account the mutual interests to protect their security."

Final Document adopted by consensus, United Nations General Assembly, First Special Session on Disarmament, 1978

Disarmament

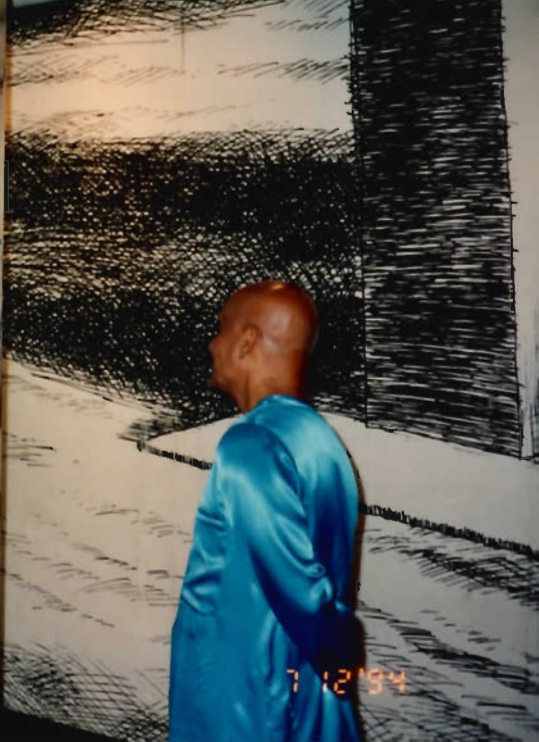
Development

The disarmament process is irreversibly under way, after several rounds of negotiations including chemical weapons, conventional weapons including air vehicles, the demilitarization of outer space, and the elimination of nuclear weapons under the terms of the INF Treaty.

Agreements with significant implications for disarmament, including the elimination of chemical weapons, and the elimination of nuclear weapons, have been the product of a long and arduous process. The process will continue to be a long and arduous one, but the progress made to date is a cause for optimism and a sign of the way forward.

The Disarmament Commission is the central body for disarmament, and its work is essential for the achievement of the goals of the Disarmament Commission.
