





A Presidential Scholar, he is a former investigative reporter. He won the National Magazine Award for Public Service from Columbia Graduate School of Journalism, the Hillman Prize, the John Hancock Award for Excellence in Business Writing and the Loeb Award.

After graduate studies in history at Princeton, Randall turned to biography and has been nominated six times for the Pulitzer Prize, three times for his biographical writings. Benjamin Franklin and His Son won a Frank Luther Mott Prize for Research from the Missouri Graduate School of Journalism. 
