Dr. Davidson Hepburn was the President of the United Nations Education, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) 35th Governing Council (2009 -2011). During that time he encouraged many to visit World Heritage sites around world. He explained why in messages he sent to the Sri Chinmoy Oneness- Home World Harmony and Peace Runs which he has experienced in his native Bahamas, Kazakhstan, Malta and other locations

Dr. Hepburn showed his continued commitment in 2018 as he personally visited the Angkor World Heritage sites in Siem Reap Cambodia with many members of the Sri Chinmoy Oneness-Home international torch relay teams from around the world.

Also part of the tour were many longtime friends from the Peace Meditation at the UN from when Davidson Hepburn was Ambassador and Permanent Representative of his country during the 1970s and 80s at the UN in NY.

It was where he first became friends with Sri Chinmoy.

Ambassador Hepburn was able to be present for many inspiration meetings of the group including cultural activities, meditations, recitations and musical performances

The first visit in Siem Reap was to **Angkor Thom**

(literally: "Great City, was the last and most enduring capital city of the Khmer empire.

It was established in the late twelfth century by King Jayavarman VII.

It covers an area of 9 km², within which are located several monuments from earlier eras as well as those established by Jayavarman and his successors.

That same day we also visited


"Ta Prohm"

the modern name of the temple at Angkor built in the Bayon style largely in the late 12th and early 13th centuries and approximately one kilometre east of Angkor Thom Founded as a Mahayana Buddhist monastery and university.

Ta Prohm is in much the same condition in which it was found: the photogenic and atmospheric combination of trees growing out of the ruins and the jungle surroundings have made it one of Angkor's most popular temples with visitors.

UNESCO inscribed Ta Prohm on the World Heritage List in 1992. Today, it is one of the most visited complexes in Cambodia's Angkor region.


The conservation and restoration of Ta Prohm is a partnership project of the Archaeological Survey of India and the APSARA (Authority for the Protection and Management of Angkor and the Region of Siem Reap)

Even the **butterflie**s seem to appreciate Dr, Hepburn's comments on the site as a number were flying around one (yelloworangegold) even landed on his head,




On this day we were drawn to some music along the path.

Bas Relief Galleries "The reliefs sculpted on the southern section of this western gallery represent a concluding episode of the Mahabharata, a renowned India epic tale. This is the Battle of Kuruksheta, when the Pandavas and the Kaurava clans meet in final, deadly combat."

"Continue to move on"

In an earlier audio interview that morning, **Dr. Hepburn was questioned about his optimism:** In part he responded by saying:

"You can't concentrate a great deal on the evil that is happening in the world. It is not going to stop. You have to continue what you are doing. It is very good. In that way you counteract the evil that is happening."

When asked if he can detect progress in the world. "I don't think it is possible for us to determine the degree of progress that we have made in achieving peace. I feel we have to look at this step by step." "You can't concentrate on the bad things. If you are going to concentrate on anything then you should concentrate on the good things. That will then pacify your concerns about the evil that is in the world." ... The moment you slink off into a corner, and concentrate on the negative things that are happening. The worse it is going to be."

"No matter how bad it gets you should be concentrating on what's good.

When I leave here, what I do is concentrate on this mediation group. You can't imagine what help, what kind of assistance, what kind of joy I get from being a part of this.




