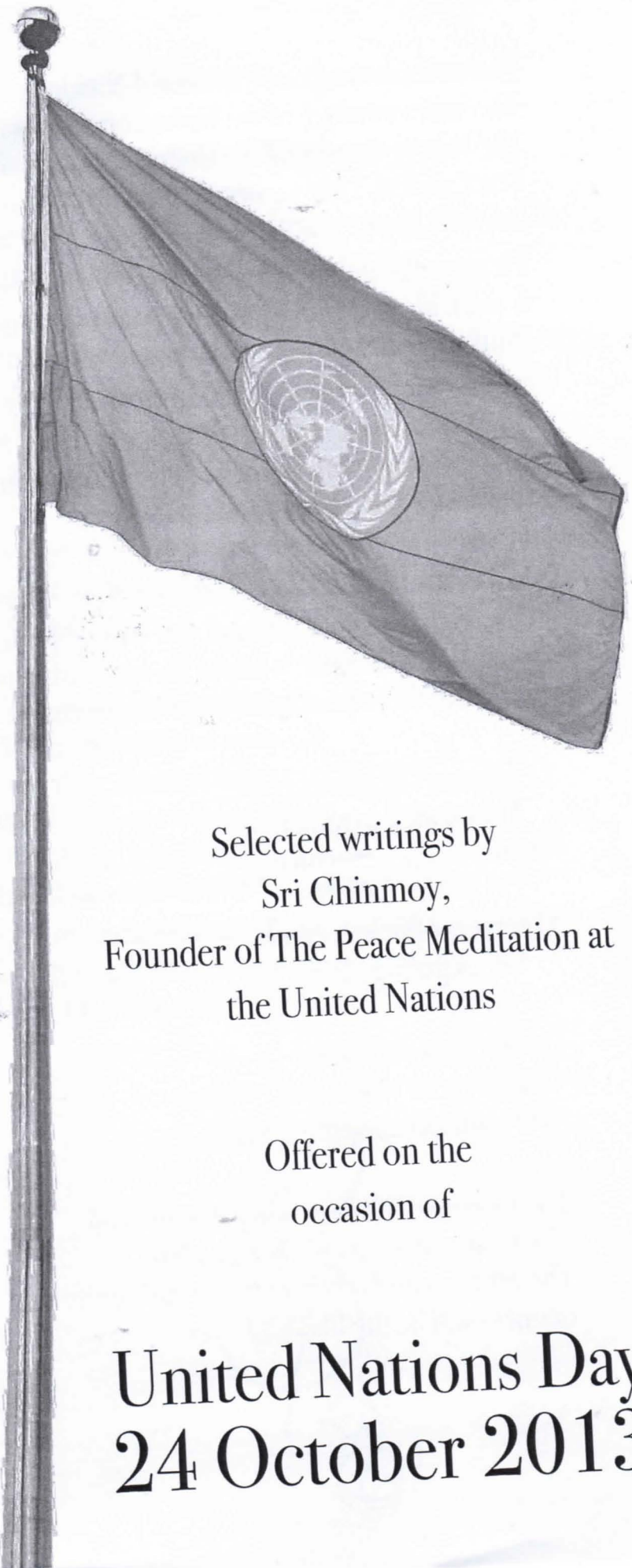

fruitful privilege.²

Peace we achieve when we do not expect anything
from the world, but only give, give and give uncondi-
tionally what we have and what we are.³

To me, the United Nations is great. Why? Because
it has high principles. To me, the United Nations is
good. Why? Because it leaves no stone unturned to
transform these principles into living realities.⁴

O dreamers of peace, come.

Let us walk together.

O lovers of peace, come.

Let us run together.

O servers of peace, come.

Let us go together.⁵
