Our proudest victory's sweetest song.

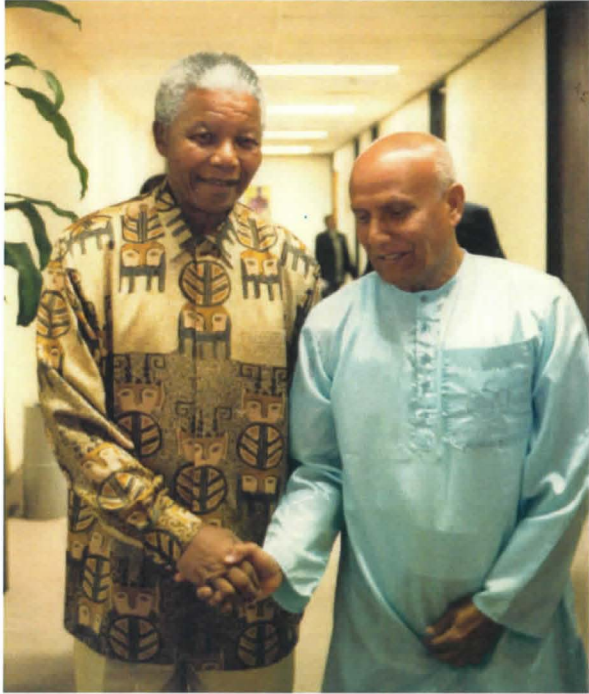
Song written by Sri Chinmoy addressing President Mandela by his reverential name, Madiba:

SRI CHINMOY (1931-2007) FIRST MET PRESIDENT NELSON MANDELA at the United Nations on 22 June 1990, in the context of Sri Chinmoy's service as leader of Peace Meditations for delegates and staff at UN Headquarters. The two met again on several occasions, in South Africa and in New York. Sri Chinmoy treasured President Mandela as a beloved brother, a revered friend and an inspiration-fountain for humanity. He wrote a book of soulful poetic tributes to the President entitled *Nelson Mandela: The Pinnacle-Pillar of Mother Earth*, and composed a number of songs in the President's honour. Sri Chinmoy's students had the privilege of performing these songs for President Mandela.

Sri Chinmoy gratefully and lovingly offered to President Mandela both the U Thant Peace Award (29 January 1996, Johannesburg) and the Lifting Up the World With a Oneness-Heart Award (9 March 1999, Pretoria).
