


INTERNATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

The Sri Chinmoy Oneness-Home **Peace Run '89**, a worldwide relay run for peace, will come to a close on 7 August in New York. The flaming torch, which started its journey on 27 April, has been passed by over 200,000 individuals over a distance of more than 31,000 miles.

Patrons of Peace Run '89 include Queen Silvia of Sweden and Mr. Flavio Cotti, Federal Counselor of Switzerland. The Run has been endorsed by the Prime Minister and Governor General of Canada and the Prime Ministers of Australia, Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden. In many countries the run has been organized in cooperation with the National Olympic Committee or the Ministry of Sports.

Peace Runs took place in the following countries:




